Abstract: The fragmentary inscription from the Via Caecilia records the repair work on a road north of Rome at the end of the second or beginning of the first century BCE. It lists the sums spent for specific work (paving of a section, bridges, and arches) and the names of the contractors. The magistrate in charge of the operation, quaestor and curator of the roads, may have wanted to remind us of the integrity he showed at the time. This document is a unicum with regard to Roman history.
