

Abstract: Nineteenth and twentieth century historians considered the stay of Amédée VIII in Bresse and Bourgogne between 1392 and 1398 as a kidnapping. However, the prince was never taken by force. The county of Savoy was an imperial fief and the risk of being accused of usurpation was real.
