**Abstract:** *Aljamiada* literature (*al-a 'yāmiyya*, “the language of the other”), “Roman language written in Arabic script”, is made up of a large number of Mudéjar and Morisco manuscripts written between the thirteenth and seventeenth centuries. With its archaic characters and Islamising lexicon, this literary language bears witness to a culture which was later annihilated by edicts and the expulsion of the Moriscos from Spain in 1609.
