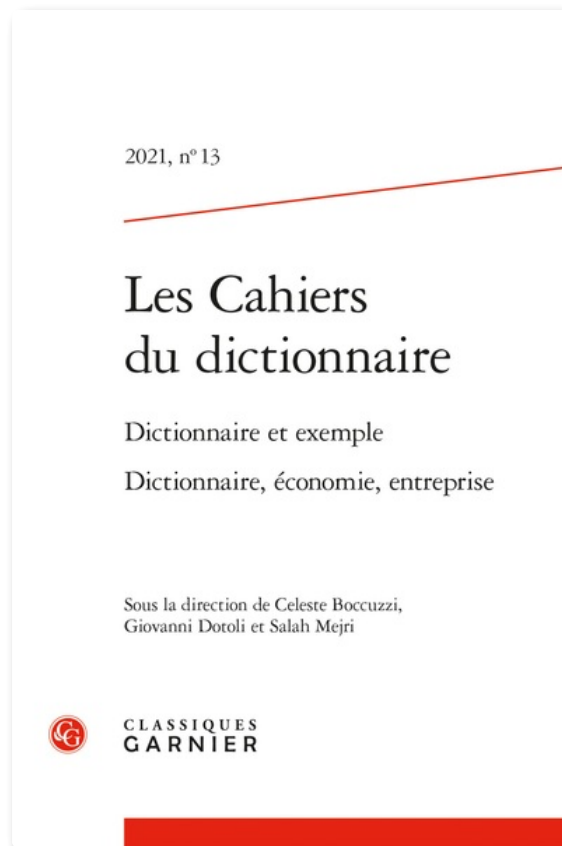




The economic language in the political language

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Abstract: When we study the place of the economical language in the political speeches, we imagine that the economical language is more complex and more technical, as the target is mainly the specialists. On the contrary, the political speeches are meant for the general public. We studied a corpus of the twelve speeches pronounced by Emmanuel Macron during the pandemic, two by Jean Castex and three by Bruno Lemaire, for a comparison.

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
