Abstract: Clément Juglar is known for having forsaken the concept of crisis for that of economic cycle. The study examines his writings related to population, in the years 1852-1862, when he came at the idea of cycle and in the years 1889-1903 when he thought about a 3rd edition of its book on the commercial crises. In opposition to the Malthusians' theses, Juglar showed that the volume of population is depending on the economic movements and walks "par soubresauts" : very fast growth in prosperity and readjustment in depression. In the long run, we have a slow but non-regular growth of the French population.
