

Abstract: The name Nerval appears under Artaud's pen for the first time in 1925 when he publishes a prose poem, "La Vitre d'amour," inspired by one of Hoffmann's tales that Nerval translated. Twenty years later it resurfaced in a letter to Georges Le Breton who had just proposed keys that were kabbalistic in nature for interpreting *Les Chimères*. A sonnet holds the attention of *Ant*onin *Art*aud, who seems to be reborn as someone other than himself: "*Ant*éros," naturally joined by "*Art*émis."
